NOW THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED by the Commissioners of Colden Fire District, in the Town of Colden, County of Erie that the Treasurer of the Colden Fire District shall be bonded in the amount of \$300,000.00.

BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED that every member of the Colden Fire District will be covered by a Blanket Surety Bond of \$100,000.00.

18. Resolution # 2022- 013 - Authorizing Per Diem and Mileage Reimbursements

WHEREAS, it is necessary that officers and employees of the District be adequately reimbursed for such expenses; and,

WHEREAS, State Finance Law, Section 48 and 109 authorizes expenses for the purposes outlined; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Fire Commissioners has reviewed the necessity for establishing a travel reimbursement program to ensure that all allocations of funds are for actual, necessary and reasonable expenses in the performance of official duties;

Commissioner Smith made a motion to utilize the per diem rates established by the Office of General Services (NYS OGS) and a mileage reimbursement rate of 58.5 cents per mile and Commissioner Shelley seconded the motion. Jarecki-Excused, Smith-Yea, Marinaccio-Yea, Ruminski-Excused, Shelley-Yea, Motion Approved

A vote was taken and the motion to utilize the per diem rates established by the Office of General Services (NYS OGS) and a mileage reimbursement rate of 58.5 cents per mile was approved.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commissioners of Colden Fire District, in the Town of Colden, County of Erie, hereby adopt the following reimbursement rates:

1. The mileage rate shall be **58.5 cents**. By adhering to this allowance, reimbursements for mileage are not taxable to the employee. Beginning January 1, 2022, the standard mileage rate for the use of a privately owned vehicle (including vans, pickups or panel trucks) will be 58.5 cents per mile.

2. The per diem reimbursement rate shall be in accordance with the New York State Reimbursement Rate (<http://www.osc.state.ny.us/agencies/travel/reimbrate.htm>) – New York State uses the per diem rates established by the Federal Government.

3. The following Travel Forms will be utilized for all travel claims and reimbursements: AC132-S (Effective 4/12), AC160-S (Effective 1/12), and AC3259-S (Effective 1/12). When Traveling 100 miles or more per trip claimant must complete the Personal Car at Rental Rate Calculator and attach to expense report.

19. Resolution # 2022- 014 - Authorizing Advance Travel Payments

WHEREAS, it is necessary at times for officers and employees of the District to incur expenses while traveling on District business; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary that funds be advanced to such officers and employees to cover such expenses; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has reviewed the necessity for and feasibility that making advanced travel payments would be advantageous to the District and its officers and employees to have the ability to pay for travel expenses without utilizing out-of-pocket funds.

23. Resolution # 2022- 018 – Authorizing Approval and Payment of Claims

3. The manner and the time in which compensation for services rendered by employees of the Commissioners shall be paid shall be in accordance with individual employment contracts. Social Security and Federal Insurance Contributions Act (FICA) will be withheld for all employees.

4. A General Fund Voucher will be prepared for all claims pursuant to State Finance Law.

5. Automatic Checking Account Deduction is authorized for amounts to be sent to NYS Comptroller's Office and bank services.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Treasurer of the Colden Fire District is authorized to pay in advance of an audit by this Board of Fire Commissioners of the Colden Fire District the following claims:

24. Resolution # 2022- 019 – Designation of Fire District Bank

Commissioner Smith made a motion to designate M&T Bank as the official depository of Fire District funds for Calendar Year 2022 and Commissioner Marinaccio seconded the motion. Jarecki-Excused, Smith-Yea, Marinaccio-Yea, Ruminski-Excused, Shelley-Yea, Motion Approved

A vote was taken and the motion to designate M&T Bank as the official depository of Fire District funds for Calendar Year 2022 was approved

M&T Bank will guarantee all District Funds through the FDIC program (\$250,000) and Collateral Accounts with the Bank of New York for the remaining funds

Investment Policy for Colden Fire District

1. This investment policy applies to all moneys and other financial resources available for investment on its own behalf.
2. The primary objectives of this fire district's investment activities are, in priority order:
 - To conform with all applicable federal, state and other legal requirements;
 - To adequately safeguard principal;
 - To provide sufficient liquidity to meet all operating requirements; and
 - To obtain a reasonable rate of return.
3. The Board of Fire Commissioners' responsibility for administration of the investment program is delegated to the Fire District Treasurer.
4. The fire district treasurer shall act responsibly as custodian of the public trust and shall avoid any transaction that might impair public confidence in the Colden Fire District. Investments shall be made with judgment and care, under circumstances then prevailing, which persons of prudence, discretion and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs, not for speculation, but for investment, considering the safety of the principal as well as the probable income to be derived.

The Fire District Treasurer shall refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with proper execution of the investment program, or which could impair his or her ability to make impartial investment decisions.

5. It is the policy of the Colden Fire District to diversify its deposits and investments by financial institution, by investment instrument and by mature scheduling.

It is the policy of the Colden Fire District for all funds coming into the hands of the fire district treasurer to be deposited or invested within five days of receipt.

The banks and trust companies authorized for the deposit of moneys up to the maximum amount in any account are:

6. Eligible securities used for collateralizing deposits shall be held by the depository named by the Board of Fire Commissioners subject to security and custodial agreements, all in accord with the applicable provisions of General Municipal Law Section 10.
7. The Board of Fire Commissioners of the Colden Fire District authorizes the fire district treasurer to invest moneys not required for immediate expenditure for terms not to exceed its projected cash flow needs in the following types of investments:
- a. Special time deposit accounts;
 - b. Certificates of Deposit;
 - c. Obligations of the United States of America;
 - d. Obligations guaranteed by agencies of the United States of America where the payment of principal and interest are guaranteed by the United States of America;
 - e. Obligations of the State of New York; and
 - f. Obligations issued by a municipality, school district or fire district other than the Colden Fire District
8. The Board authorizes the use of electronic monthly statements to prevent from paying bank fees when they apply

All investment obligations shall be payable or redeemable at the option of the Colden Fire District within such times as the proceeds for which the moneys were provided and, in the case of obligations purchased with the proceeds of bonds or notes, shall be payable or redeemable at the option of the Colden Fire District within 2 years of the date of purchase.

25. Resolution # 2022- 020 – Review of Expenditures (Calendar Year 2021)

Accounting of all monies received and disbursed during the preceding year; and availability of all books, records, receipts, orders, vouchers and cancelled checks or check images. (Records will be in the District Office with January Invoices to be viewed)

Commissioner Smith made a motion to approve Calendar Year 2021 expenditures and Commissioner Shelley seconded the motion. Jarecki-Excused, Smith-Yea, Marinaccio-Yea, Ruminski-Excused, Shelley-Yea, Motion Approved

A vote was taken on January 11, 2022 and the motion to sanctioned Calendar Year 2021 expenditures was approved

BE IT RESOLVED that the Fire District Treasurer will submit to the Board of Fire Commissioners a copy of the annual report required by General Municipal Law Section 30 within the next sixty days.

- **Personnel, Insurance and Service Award Committee** - The Board's standing Personnel, Insurance and Service Award Committee shall be concerned with the functions, activities, operations, compensation, Worker Compensation Claims, negotiations, and membership applications from Fire Company, and the welfare of District personnel.

Primary: Commissioner Marinaccio, Alternate: Commissioner Jarecki

*Active Status is when a firefighter attends calls that meet LOSAP Standards and completes all mandatory training requirements (i.e. OSHA, etc.)

*If an Active Firefighter is in default of the minimum requirements for maintaining an active membership, they will be notified by the Fire Chief. Member will be placed in a remediation status and a supervision program will be established by the Fire Chief for that member. Loss of active status will result if the member defaults in the remedial program.

*All injuries will be reported to the Board of Fire Commissioners immediately and on a monthly basis whether or not there were any injuries. Fire Chief will prepare an Incident Report for each injury and submit to the Fire District.

This Committee shall be concerned with the insurance coverage of the Fire District and its employees. The District shall carry all types of insurance to prevent losses due to adverse judgments for death or personal injury and damage or destruction of District property, or property of others, by fire or other casualty. The

Committee shall also be concerned with maintaining and manage the Service Award Program and shall coordinate all contributions to the service provider.

*January 1st to December 31st will be the yearly dates for maintaining the attendance records for the Service Award Program.

*Entitlement to the Service Award Program is when a firefighter achieves 50 points and meets the minimum requirements of §217 General Municipal Law.

- **Maintenance of Buildings, Apparatus, Driver Certification, Communications, Committee** – The Board’s standing Committee shall be concerned with the maintenance of fire fighter equipment and driver selection and testing that will ensure that only the safest drivers operate District equipment. This Committee will also be concerned with the planning of facilities, facility repairs, acquisition of new fire apparatus and equipment to protect the Fire District.

Primary: Commissioner Shelley, Alternate: Commissioner Ruminski

Fire Apparatus (1, 2, 3, 5, 7 and 8) - Fire District Driving Certification Official is Commissioner Shelley – All personnel will be tested on an annual basis.

- **Executive Board Committee** – The Board’s standing Executive Board Committee shall be concerned with acting as a liaison between the Fire Company and the Fire Board. Committee will attend all meetings of the Executive Board of the Fire Company.

Primary: Commissioner Marinaccio

- **Training Committee** – The Board’s standing Training Committee shall be concerned with the readiness of firefighters and EMS personnel. Ensure that all mandatory training is scheduled and conducted. Provides assistance to the Fire Chief when requested.

Primary: Commissioner Shelley, Alternate: Commissioner Smith & Colden 9-1

- **Standard Operating Guideline (SOG)** – Review, Maintain and present updates to the District as necessary all established Standard Operating Guidelines.

Primary: Commissioner Jarecki, Alternate: Commissioner Smith

- **Medical Readiness** - The Board’s standing Medical Readiness Committee shall be concerned with maintaining medical records in accordance with Privacy and Security of Health Information Program of New York State (HIPPA) and SOG #

II-03 – Medical Surveillance Program. Ensuring that all active personnel have a current physical and that all physicals are within a 12 month period.

Primary: Commissioner Smith, Alternate: Colden 9-3

- **Appointment of Privacy Officer:** The Privacy Officer is needed to oversee the Privacy SOG and monitor the PCR filing program.

Primary: Commissioner Smith, Alternates: Colden 9-3 and Douglas Hyde
